She liked the outdoors and enjoyed hunting. Kathryn was an excellent marksman and did it all through her life time, killing a trophy deer at age 85. Through help from friends and family, her trophy was featured in Texas Trophy Hunters magazine. Kathryn was a lifetime resident of the Comanche area, a member of South Leon Baptist Church in Newburg, and later attended Eastside Baptist Church in Comanche.

Kathryn is survived by daughter, Peggy Elliott; grandson, Michael Elliott and wife Veronica of San Antonio; 2 great grandchildren, Caleb and Hannah.
