He ribbed me about the engine, but respected the stick shift, so he said it evened out. He told me “I’ll help you put in a real motor when that one craps out at 70,000 miles” not being a jerk, just being matter of fact about it. A couple of years later I traded it in for a nicer Ram, this time big engine, but automatic transmission. Again, Tim wanted to check it out. This time he laughed, good you got the right engine but it’s automatic!” I said doesn’t it even out!? He said not as well as before, but I guess so.” He made the same offer to help replace the motor for me at 70,000 miles. Tim was a decent man, always there to help out a friend.

I will always remember him showing up for work, you could hear him coming from miles away! Always on the coolest bike or in the coolest truck. He loved living.

I miss our quiet conversations in his office, his guidance was always Appreciated and sought out. He could see issues from multiple angles and help you make the best decision as he saw it. He will he missed by all that knew him.
